



WASTE MANAGEMENT AT SOUTHSEA MARINA

To help maintain the high standards at the marina, here is a helpful guide to waste management at Southsea Marina.

General Waste

We have 8 General Waste bins in situ across the site, as well as a separate larger bin for 'bulky' general waste located in the boatyard at the rear of the sea school.

Items that **CAN** go in these bins: All non-recyclable, non-hazardous waste.

Items that **CANNOT** go in these bins: All other waste that is recyclable, glass or hazardous waste.

Dry Mixed Recycling

We have 5 Dry Mixed Recycling bins in situ across the site. All items must be put in the bin either loose or in clear sacks only.

Items that **CAN** go in these bins: Cardboard, Plastic Bottles, Paper, Tins and Cans.

Items that **CANNOT** go in these bins: All non-recyclable waste including Glass, Food and Hazardous Waste.

Mixed Glass

We have 6 Mixed Glass bins in situ across the site. All items must be empty when put in the bin.

Items that **CAN** go in these bins: All colours of glass bottles and jars.

Items that **CANNOT** go in these bins: All other waste that is not glass.

Hazardous Materials

We have various separate Hazardous Material bins for specific hazardous materials, all located in the boatyard. All hazardous material **MUST** be put in the correct bins.

The separate hazardous materials bins at Southsea Marina are for: Oil Filters and Oily Rags and Containers, Batteries, Empty Paint Tins, and Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE).

Any items that are not listed above must **NOT** be put in the hazardous material bins.
